**PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS**

- Roadway widening and median width modifications to incorporate buffered bike lanes
- Replace existing signalization at Atlantic Blvd, Royal Palm Blvd and Wiles Road to accommodate roadway widening
- Pedestrian signal upgrades
- ADA / curb ramp upgrades
- Regrading of roadside drainage swales
- Limited tree removal due to roadway widening
- Milling, resurfacing and restriping of roadway

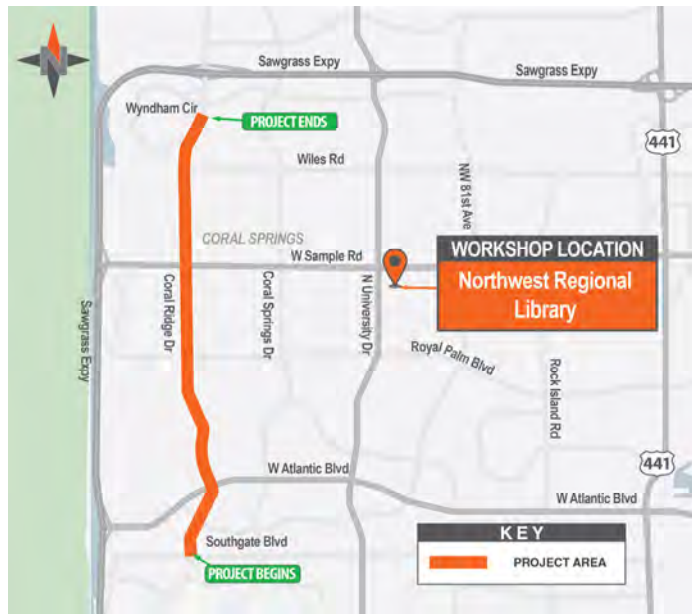
