# Scholarship Program

As part of the City's Annual MLK Celebration, the Coral Springs MLK Committee has offered a scholarship program in honor of Dr. King for the past 25 years. The program has been funded in part by the Coral Springs Community Chest. The Committee augments funds through fundraising events and donations sought from local businesses and individuals. Scholarships are awarded regardless of ethnicity, race or creed.

Through the Committee's efforts, over 300 high school seniors have received scholarships in varying amounts based primarily on financial need. The students apply the scholarship money towards tuition costs at any institution of higher learning. The scholarship is available to high school seniors who live in Coral Springs and attend one of the five high schools serving Coral Springs: J.P. Taravella High, Coral Springs High, Stoneman Douglas High, Coral Springs Charter School and Coral Glades High.

The purpose of the Scholarship Program is **"to provide funds to needy, local students who, through their words and actions, embody the spirit of Dr. King's teachings."** Although preference is given to students with financial need, consideration is also given to the quality of community service performed by the applicants. By judging applications in this manner, students compete for the scholarship by demonstrating Dr. King's philosophy of giving, caring and community service.

Examples of past student initiatives include tutoring, feeding the homeless, assisting with blood drives and holiday activities, as well as worthwhile projects for nursing homes, the disabled, houses of worship and other community organizations.

The Scholarship Program is entirely dependent upon the generous contributions of individuals and corporations in the community. We would appreciate your assistance in making a difference in the lives of these deserving students.
